

FOR MASTER'S AND BACHELOR'S STUDENTS:

The merit ranking will be determined based on the score calculated as follows:

$$P = (MP * CC / CFU)$$

Where:

P = merit score

MP = weighted average of exam grades (**not modules, but full exams recorded in Esse3!**) earned up to the application deadline

CFU = total number of CFU required for the academic year in which the student is enrolled (e.g., 2nd year = 120 CFU, etc.)

CC = number of CFU earned as of the application deadline

For the purposes of the merit ranking, only exams passed and recorded in Esse3 will be considered (no modules)

For students enrolled in a year beyond the standard duration of study, a credit value equal to the number of credits due (60 per academic year) will be applied, plus the credits to be calculated for each year beyond the standard duration (60 per year). An exception applies to students provisionally enrolled in a master's degree program who have not renewed their enrollment beyond the standard duration in the bachelor's degree program; an additional 30 CFU will be applied to their total.

FOR PhD STUDENTS:

For PhD students, the merit ranking will be based on the final grade awarded for their master's degree. Higher final grades will receive higher scores.

BONUS POINTS AND RESOLUTION OF A TIE

The following bonus points will also be calculated for bachelor's, master's, and PhD students:

- 10 points for those who have indicated in their application the choice to enroll in both semesters of the Regional Living Lab

In the event of a tie in ranking scores, priority will be given to the younger candidate.
