Summer School in Applied Health Econometrics and Health Policy

July, 14/15th - 23rd 2022 (Extended format for 6 ECTS: July, 14/15th - 29th 2022) Bergamo, Italy



Presentation

AHEHP focuses on the analysis of health care markets, health behaviors and policy interventions, through the support of applied econometric methods.

Health care expenditure accounts for about 10% of GDP worldwide and grows over time due to ageing population, the impact of chronic diseases, fast technological change, and new pandemic challenges. Health data analysis and health econometrics play an important role in supporting decisions to address fragility and build resilience of modern health care systems.

The Summer School brings together graduate, PhD students and health care professionals, and introduces them to the challenging world of statistical and econometric tools applied to health care, with the participation of leading researchers in health economics and public health from Italian and foreign universities.



Structure and tasks

The Summer school includes **5 days of full time** lectures, STATA laboratories and seminars, and **3 days part time** (58 hours). A half-day crash course of Introduction to applied econometrics using STATA is also available just before the start of the Summer school (4 hours).

Applied econometric exercises will be assigned on daily basis and performed with STATA after the classes (2 hours of group/individual work per day).

A supervised **group project** will be developed during the week following the courses and discussed in the final exam (40 hours, only for attendants taking the final exam).

A certificate of attendance will be provided with the acknowledgement of 6 ECTS, conditional upon lectures and lab attendance, completion of daily handworks and final project.

- Students from other institutions will get a certificate that the Summer School accounts for 6 ECTS.


